Unconditional Surrender: When Wars Are Fought to Win

QUOTE: One week ago, on February 28, the United States and Israel commenced attack on Iran. At first, it seemed to be merely a ramped-up continuation of Operation Midnight Hammer, the raid conducted last June when the United States following up on Israel's preliminary attacks, destroyed ("completely and totally obliterated") three key nuclear sites at Fordow, Natanz, and Isfahan. It was an extraordinary operation, in which four B-2 bombers, having flown for 30 hours from the United States, mounted an astonishing precision strike with fourteen 30,000-pound bunker-buster bombs, together with submarine-fired Tomahawk cruise missiles.

But Midnight Hammer was merely a preliminary salvo compared to Epic Fury, the pulverizing assault that the United States and Israel (under the name "Roaring Lion") launched last Saturday. The world has not seen anything like this since 1945, when the United States and its allies crushed Nazi Germany and Imperial Japan. Having learned from the aftermath of the Great War that armistice is often but another name for false victory, President Trump adopted as his motto the phrase that definitively ended World War II: "unconditional surrender."

Trump understands, as so many "experts" have failed to understand, that the object of armed conflict is to win. So often in recent decades, the United States has embarked on war, or warlike activity, with no plan for victory. Early on in the War on Terror, for example, the U.S. located Mullah Omar, the Taliban head honcho who coddled al-Qaeda, in Afghanistan. The American forces were not, however, allowed simply to take him out. Restrictive rules of engagement required them to wire back to Washington to ask permission. By the time the proper authorities could answer, it was too late. Omar had vanished back into some unknown cave.

There is nothing like that happening now. Within just four or five days, virtually all of Iran's senior leadership has been eliminated. Then its replacements were eliminated. "Their army is gone," President Trump said a few days ago. "Their navy

gone. Their communications are gone. Their leaders are gone. . . . Their Air Force wiped out. . . . They have 32 ships. All 32 are at the bottom of the ocean. Other than that," he quipped, "they're doing very well!"

Trump Announces Military Coalition With Latin American Leaders to Eradicate Cartels

QUOTE: U.S. President Donald Trump on March 7 welcomed his Latin American allies to Florida for a summit focused on addressing regional issues and announcing a new military coalition to combat drug cartels in the Western Hemisphere.

"On this historic day, we come together to announce a brand new military coalition to eradicate the criminal cartels plaguing our region," Trump said as he began his remarks at the summit.

He said that the new partnership, called the Americas Counter Cartel Coalition, will leverage military resources, including the possible use of missiles, to combat the cartels.

The heads of state of Argentina, Bolivia, Chile, Costa Rica, the Dominican Republic, Ecuador, El Salvador, Honduras, Panama, Paraguay, and Trinidad and Tobago attended today's summit, the White House said.

The event, called the Shield of the Americas Summit, took place at Trump National Doral Club in Miami and is the first such regional meeting to bring together, as the State Department described, "like-minded allies" in the Western Hemisphere.

"We're going to be doing some incredible things together," Trump told the leaders.

All countries in attendance are governed by right-wing or center-right parties, while left-leaning governments such as Brazil, Colombia, and Mexico did not participate in the summit.

BBC Caught Mistranslating Hegseth Speech, After Previously Doctoring Trump Address

QUOTE: The BBC is facing backlash after BBC Persian mistranslated comments made by U.S. Secretary of War Pete Hegseth during a broadcast.

In the original speech, Hegseth made clear that U.S. military operations in Iran are aimed at Iran's regime rather than its citizens, stating, "It turns out the regime that chanted 'Death to America and death to Israel' was gifted death from America and death from Israel. This is not a so-called regime change war, but the regime sure did change, and the world is better off for it."

However, BBC Persian translated this as: "It turns out the people that chanted 'Death to America and death to Israel' was gifted death from America and death from Israel," making it look as though the Iranian people as a whole, rather than the Islamic Republic's ruling mullahs, are being targeted.

The mistranslation drew swift backlash, and BBC Persian subsequently acknowledged the issue and issued a correction, claiming it was an unintentional mistake made by the interpreter during real-time simultaneous translation.

The incident follows a major scandal involving the BBC doctoring a speech by President Donald J. Trump on January 6, 2021, for a program aired shortly before the U.S. elections in 2024. BBC Panorama showed a clip of Trump saying, "We're gonna walk down to the Capitol, and I'll be with you, and we fight. We fight like hell and if you don't fight like hell, you're not gonna have a country anymore," making it appear as though he directly incited disorder.

In reality, Trump said, "We're going to walk down to the Capitol, and we're going to cheer on our brave senators and congressmen and women"—the BBC had created its clip by splicing together two sections of Trump's speech close to an hour apart.

The broadcaster's Director General and Head of News both abruptly resigned following the scandal, but it has not officially admitted any malicious wrongdoing and is fighting a multi-billion-dollar lawsuit from Trump.

February Jobs Report: Beneath the Headlines, a Strong Labor Market

QUOTE: The February jobs report will inevitably produce a round of cautionary headlines. The topline figure non-farm payrolls declining by 92,000—will be cited as evidence that the Trump economy is weakening.

That interpretation misses the larger story.

To understand what is really happening, let's dig beneath the surface of the repo and place the data in context.

First, the February payroll number was distorted by several temporary factors. Unseasonably cold weather disrupted construction, transportation, and other outdoor employment during the survey period. Meanwhile, a large healthcare strike in California and Hawaii temporarily removed tens of thousands of workers from payrolls.

Events like these can swing a single monthly report but say little about the underlying strength of the labor market.

When those temporary factors are taken into account, the broader employment picture remains fundamentally solid.

The unemployment rate held steady at 4.4 percent in February—still historically low. Labor force participation dipped during the month, reflecting both normal household-survey volatility and the ongoing slowdown in labor-force growth as immigration inflows have fallen sharply.

In other words, Americans who want to work are working.

Equally important is the concept economists call the "breakeven" job creation rate—the number of jobs that must be created each month simply to keep the unemployment rate from rising. Because the labor force is now growing much more slowly than in previous years, that breakeven level is relatively modest, roughly 16,000 jobs per month.

So far in 2026, the economy has added a net 34,000 jobs across the first two months of the year. That works out to roughly 17,000 jobs per month—just above the estimated 16,000 breakeven pace required to keep the unemployment rate from rising. In other words, the labor market is not deteriorating. It is stabilizing at a sustainable level.

But the most important story in the report is not the monthly job count. It is wages and productivity.

Average hourly earnings rose 3.8 percent over the past year, slightly stronger than expected. Workers are also taking home larger paychecks as they log more hours on the job. Manufacturing workers, in particular, are seeing meaningful gains. Weekly earnings for factory workers are rising at more than five percent annually reflecting the ongoing recovery in industrial wages. This is the sweet spot of Trumpnomics.

At the same time, productivity growth is strengthening—especially in manufacturing. Over the past year, factory productivity has grown at its fastest pace in nearly two decades.

This combination of rising productivity and rising wages is exactly what policymakers want to see. When workers produce more output per hour, businesses can raise pay without pushing prices higher. That dynamic allows living standards improve without reigniting inflation.

Put simply, the American labor market is becoming leaner, more productive, and more wage-driven.

Taken together, the February jobs report does not signal weakness. Instead, it reflects a labor market settling into a more sustainable pattern—one characterized by rising wages, stronger productivity, and steady employment. That is the foundation of durable economic growth.

Seventh Circuit Judge Kenneth Lee said in his opinion: "Our constitutional structure topple if a single district court sits atop the President, Congress, the Supreme Court and the federal appellate court. Our allegiance is always to the law and the Constitution."

Trump can suspend refugee admissions, US appeals court rules

QUOTE: President Donald Trump has the authority to indefinitely suspend admissions of foreign nationals seeking to enter the United States under the U.S. refugee resettlement program, a federal appeals court ruled on Thursday, backing a key element of his hardline approach toward immigration.

A California-based three-judge panel of the 9th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals reached that conclusion as it overturned most of the injunctions issued by a judge in Seattle last year against Trump’s halt on refugee admissions and related actions.

The 9th Circuit last year allowed Trump’s policy to proceed, pausing most of U.S. District Judge Jamal Whitehead’s decisions in favor of the plaintiffs while the U.S. Justice Department’s appeal played out.

President Trump froze refugee resettlement after taking office in January 2025, saying the U.S. Refugee Admissions Program, orUSRAP, must ensure that refugees admitted to the U.S. “appropriately assimilate.” His policy prompted a class-action lawsuit by refugees, family members and resettlement organizations.

Senior U.S. Circuit Judge Jay Bybee, writing on Thursday for the 9th Circuit panel, said the court recognized the “enormous practical implications” of its decision to largely overturn rulings issued in the case by Whitehead. Bybee said the result was due to Congress granting the president sweeping powers to suspend entry to immigrants. “Whether that consequence reflects prudent policy is not a question for this court,” Bybee wrote.

Seventh Circuit Formally Vacates Injunction on ICE Use of Force

QUOTE: A split Seventh Circuit panel has thrown out a Chicago federal judge's injunction on use of force by immigration agents, which it previously paused pending appeal in a case that now "appears to be moot."

"Vacated is the best way to wipe the slate clean," Thursday's unsigned decision says, noting the underlying case was dismissed without prejudice.

The injunction was "overbroad" and "constitutionally suspect," and if it isn't formally thrown out, the plaintiffs could "refile in federal court tomorrow and try to reimplement the injunction anew," the majority wrote.

The opinion also formally dismissed the appeal.

Biochemist and mRNA Pioneer Says CIA Used Ticks as Bio-Weapon.

QUOTE: Dr. Robert W. Malone says he has uncovered new evidence that suggest Lyme disease was—at least in part—the result of U.S. government and military attempts at developing a biological weapon in the mid-1960s. The physician and biochemist, who was a pioneer of mRNA technology, cites a new report that appears to indicate the U.S. Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) attempted to use disease-infected ticks against Cuba in 1962.

According to author and Lyme disease researcher Kris Newby, a former CIA operative—said to now be in his seventies—came forward and spoke with her about a secret mission in which the “strangest thing he ever did was drop infecte ticks on Cuban sugarcane workers,” stating that his C-123 aircraft was “almost skimming the surface of the Caribbean to avoid Cuban radar.” Following the mission and his return to the United States, the operative told Newby that his young son became ill and developed a severe fever that required emergency surgery. The operative further tells Newby that his commander at the CIA subsequently ordered him to “burn all the clothes you took to Cuba. Burn everything.”

The testimony is notable as it builds on long-standing allegations that the U.S. military engaged in dangerous and unethical biological weapons research during the Cold War for use against the Soviet Union and Cuba. Importantly, there is documentation that the military did engage in experimental biological weapons testing, including an Operation Mongoose memo from March 13, 1962, sent to Brigadier General Edward Geary Lansdale directly mentioning a study about an operation aimed at incapacitating Cuban sugarcane workers.

Malone further claims that, “Between 1966 and 1969, the U.S. military released 282,800 lone star ticks made radioactive with Carbon-14 across Virginia sites alo bird migration routes. The radioactive marking allowed researchers to track the ticks’ spread using Geiger counters over several years.” He added that prior to th release, “lone star ticks were not found above the Mason-Dixon Line. Within year

of the Virginia releases, they had established populations on Long Island for the first time.”

Though the revelations regarding an alleged mission to incapacitate Cuban sugarcane workers do lend some credibility to the claim that Lyme disease was the result of biological weapons testing, it is also important to stress that the bacteriologists that are responsible for the condition, *Borrelia burgdorferi*, weren't discovered until 1982
