FBI has 'substantiated' irregularities in Georgia 2020 vote counts, probing if they were intentional

QUOTE: The FBI has "substantiated" some major irregularities in how votes were counted in Georgia's largest urban area in the aftermath of the 2020 election and probing whether those failures were intentional efforts to violate federal election law, according to a bombshell affidavit unsealed by a federal court on Tuesday.

FBI Special Agent Hugh Raymond Evans first filed the affidavit last month to establish probable cause for a raid that seized about 700 boxes of Georgia 2020 elections ballots from a storage warehouse in the Atlanta area, after getting a referral from Trump White House election integrity czar Kurt Olsen.

The affidavit included information gleaned from FBI interviews with about a dozen unnamed witnesses recounting various allegations that dated back to the disputed 2020 election in Georgia in which Joe Biden was narrowly declared the winner over Donald Trump.

"Some of those allegations have been disproven while some of those allegations have been substantiated, including through admissions by Fulton County," Evans wrote. "This warrant application is part of an FBI criminal investigation into whether any of the improprieties were intentional acts that violated federal criminal laws."

Many of the substantiated allegations were previously reported by Just the News over the last five years based on its review of ballot records.

Evans' affidavit, dated Jan. 28, cited five major areas of irregularities under investigation, including that:

- Fulton County has admitted that it does not have scanned images of all the 528,777 ballots counted during the Original Count or the 527,925 ballots counted during the state's first recount, a major loss of evidence.
- Fulton County has confirmed that during the Recount of votes, some ballots were scanned multiple times. "Ballot images made available in response to public recount requests show ballots with unique markings duplicated within the ballot images, the affidavit said.
- During the Risk Limiting Audit, auditors counting the votes by hand reported vote tallies for batches inconsistent with the actual votes within the batch. "The State's Performance Review Board reported that Secretary of State investigators confirm inaccurate batch tallies from the Risk Limiting Audit," the affidavit said.
- Auditors assisting in the Risk Limiting Audit reported counting purported absentee ballots that had "never been creased or folded, as would be required for the ballot to be mailed to the voter and for the ballot to be returned in the sealed envelope requiring the voter's signature for authentication."
- On the day of the deadline to report the Recount results, Fulton County reported a recount totaling 511,343 ballots, 17,434 ballots fewer than the original count. "The following day, Fulton County then reported a total of 527,925 ballots counted," the affidavit noted.

Trump set to repeal landmark climate finding in huge regulatory rollback this week

QUOTE: The Trump administration is set this week to overturn an Obama-era scientific finding that serves as the legal basis for federal greenhouse-gas regulation, the Environmental Protection Agency said on Monday.

Repealing the so-called endangerment finding, a scientific determination that greenhouse gas emissions endanger human health, would remove the legal foundation for broader greenhouse gas regulation and would mark the Trump administration’s most wide-reaching climate policy rollback.

The Trump administration has been working on the repeal for over a year. The proposed rule was sent to the White House Office of Management and Budget for

review on January 7. The proposal, unveiled last summer, got over a half a million public comments.

The repeal would remove the regulatory requirements to measure, report, certify and comply with federal GHG emission standards for cars, administration officials told the Wall Street Journal, but would not apply to stationary sources such as power plants.

An EPA spokesperson said the endangerment finding was used by the Obama and Biden Administrations to “justify trillions of dollars of greenhouse gas regulation covering new vehicles and engines.”

No More Super Bowls for California – Seahawks QB Will Reportedly Owe Money for Winning a Ring Thanks to State's Insane Tax Laws

QUOTE: There is something uniquely broken about a system where winning the Super Bowl can end up costing you money.

That is reportedly the reality for Seattle Seahawks quarterback Sam Darnold after Sunday night.

Darnold will actually owe the state of California money for winning Super Bowl LVI at Levi's Stadium in Santa Clara.

The Seahawks beat the New England Patriots 29–13, and Darnold earned \$178,000 for helping lift his first Lombardi Trophy.

California, however, reportedly plans to give him a tax bill of \$249,000 for the pleasure.

In the run-up to the game, the sports business website Sportico broke it all down.

Under the NFL's collective bargaining agreement, each member of the winning Super Bowl team receives \$178,000 — whether starting quarterbacks or second-string bench warmers, Sportico reported. However, the players aren't just taxed on their winnings in the game. They are also subject to California's so-called "jock tax," which demands a cut of an athlete's income based on how many days he works in the state.

Those days are called "duty days," and after arriving in Northern California on February 1, Darnold and the Seahawks accumulated eight of them.

Add up all those numbers, and the state of California decides what its cut is going to be. That is how, according to Sportico, Darnold will get a \$249,000 tax bill for a game that the NFL rules only paid him \$178,000 for winning.

This is not about feeling sorry for NFL players. No one needs to break out a violin for a quarterback making nine figures on a contract to play a game.

The point here is how out of touch and punitive California's tax structure has become.

Caring for Mom Is an Education in Scams and Fraud

QUOTE: It was summer 2021, and my mother's desk was a mess, including a torn envelope from the IRS shoved in the back of a drawer.

"Mom?" I asked. "Did you pay your taxes?"

My mother, increasingly forgetful at 84, said she wasn't sure. She told me to call accountant of 30 years, who said the taxes hadn't been paid but that he would take care of it.

That's not all he took care of.

Within the year, a family member had my mother sign a blank check, which the accountant (or someone in his office) filled out for \$25,000 to supposedly take on paying my mother's bills – a task I was already doing. Instead of using the money for bills, the accountant paid himself the lion's share of the funds. He then sent n

an invoice for work I'd previously paid him for, at which point I told him never to contact my mother or me again.

The accountant does not work in some grubby backroom but for a white-shoe firm in a Manhattan office tower. I don't know if this firm does legitimate business. I know that the moment he had the opportunity to take advantage of a decades-long trust, he took it.

He's not the only one. In the six years since I've taken my mother's finances in hand I've dealt with dozens of schemes meant to bilk the elderly, including phone scammers who promised my mother she had won a Mercedes, home health aides who inflated their hours, people forging my mother's signature, and a relative who had her sign over her car.

As hard as I tried to protect my mother from con artists, there is no way I could have predicted all the schemes, both clever and dumb, that industries and individuals constantly perpetrate on the elderly. Some will be strangers; others will be trusted confidantes and family members. Did I mention the beloved attorney who convinced my mother to sign away farm equipment worth nearly \$200,000?

Predators targeting the elderly are on the rise because there have never been as many to prey upon. An estimated 67 million baby boomers live in the U.S., with a combined wealth of \$85 trillion, according to Federal Reserve data, a veritable banquet for thieves, made all the easier by online trickery.

Several measures now before Congress aim to combat scams and fraud targeting people 60 and older. The Scam Compound Accountability and Mobilization (SCAM) Act passed the Senate in December 2025 and now moves to the House. The STOP Scams Against Seniors Act was introduced that same month, but has yet to be passed into law. While the first bill targets international fraud and the second aims to coordinate federal, state, and local efforts to protect seniors from scams, the

cognitive struggles of older adults will undoubtedly make it difficult for law enforcement to gather evidence and catch wrongdoers.

The most important piece of advice I have for those with failing parents is this: Get on their finances five years earlier than you think you need to. This, because they are not going to tell you that things are going downhill, or they won't have noticed, or they're embarrassed to ask for help.

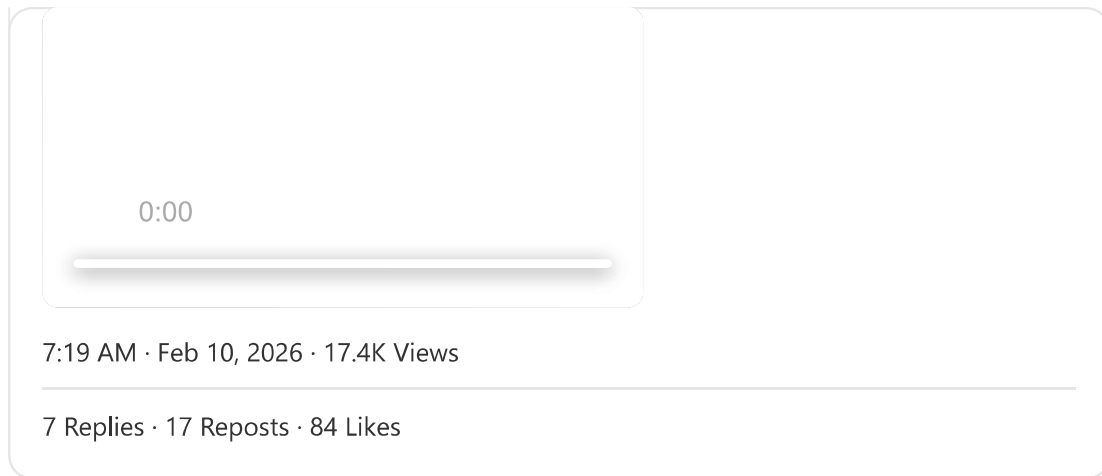
