

Denmark's Dirty Little Secret About Population Control in Greenland

QUOTE: Denmark has controlled Greenland since 1721. Indigenous peoples live there for thousands of years before that.

But with regard to Greenland and the women who have lived there, Denmark has had a dirty little secret centered on population control: a relatively recent birth control practice that was forced on thousands of women, for which the country apologized in September 2025.

A group of independent researchers released a report that followed a two-year

investigation. That investigation found that Denmark — from 1966 through 1992 forced sterilization on more than 4,500 women and girls in Greenland, some as young as 12 years old. Many, if not most, were never told.

In the name of population control, doctors implanted an intra-uterine device (IU in the unsuspecting patients.

Revelations of this birth control program only came to light in 2022 through a podcast called *Spiralkampagnen*. While the revelations first emerged three years ago, Denmark's prime minister, Mette Frederiksen, only issued an apology to Greenland in the Fall of 2025.

Researchers took testimony from 410 cases, 349 of which involved health consequences for the affected women. Hundreds of the victims were from Greenland's Indigenous population, but the program impacted over 4,000 women and girls in total. While the researchers revealed that patients had the IUDs implanted without consent, in some cases women and girls received injections that left them infertile.

The Danish health ministry said "women who were given contraception against their knowledge or consent between 1960 and 1991 can apply for individual payouts of 300,000 Danish kroner (about \$46,000)" starting in April of this year.

Pundits have been having a little fun with the prospect of the U.S. taking control of Greenland at the expense of such a small country as Denmark, but I'm not laughing now. Stories like these provide proof that even a small country can foster the worst kind of inhumanity, and for that reason alone, it should be taken seriously.

Texas Sits On 1.6 Billion Barrels Of Undiscovered Oil, New Study Shows

QUOTE: A new federal geological assessment finds that deep shale formations beneath the Permian Basin contain an estimated 1.6 billion barrels of previously undiscovered oil, underscoring Texas' continued role as a cornerstone of U.S. energy production.

The study estimates that the same formations also hold 28.3 trillion cubic feet of undiscovered natural gas, resources that could be extracted using existing drilling technology. At current consumption rates, those volumes would be sufficient to supply the United States with natural gas for roughly 10 months and oil for about 10 weeks, according to the assessment.

Despite decades of oil and gas activity in the Permian Basin, these formations have produced relatively little oil to date — about 26 million barrels since the late 1990s, roughly equivalent to one day of total U.S. consumption. Advances in horizontal

drilling and hydraulic fracturing have only recently made these deep shale layers accessible.

"The U.S. economy and our way of life depend on energy, and these assessments point to resources that industry hasn't discovered yet," the study's authors noted emphasizing that the findings reflect long-term geologic potential rather than near-term production forecasts.

Illegal Aliens Cost Texas Hospitals Over \$1 Billion in 2025

QUOTE: Texas hospitals incurred more than \$1 billion in health care costs for patients not lawfully present in the United States during fiscal year 2025, according to new data obtained from the Texas Health and Human Services Commission.

The figures were collected under an executive order issued by Gov. Greg Abbott in August 2024, which requires hospitals to report the cost of inpatient and emergency care provided to individuals in the country illegally. Under Abbott's

order, hospitals are also required to inform patients that responses regarding immigration status will not affect their care, as required by federal law.

Statewide totals show 313,742 hospital visits from patients not legally present in U.S., costing hospitals \$1.05 billion during the reporting period. The largest share of the expense—more than \$565 million—came from inpatient discharges for non-Medicaid and non-CHIP patients.

Emergency department visits accounted for roughly \$230 million, while total inpatient care exceeded \$820 million, underscoring that long-term hospitalizations, not emergency treatment alone, are driving much of the cost.

Although hospitals are required under federal law to deliver the care, unpaid medical costs are ultimately passed along to Texans. Taxpayers absorb the burden through higher insurance rates, public hospital funding, and state health programs.



5- World Peace?

Trump Wants Nations to Pay \$1 Billion to Stay on His Peace Board

QUOTE: The Trump administration is asking countries that want a permanent spot on his new Board of Peace to contribute at least \$1 billion.

According to a draft charter for the proposed group seen by Bloomberg, President Donald Trump would serve as its inaugural chairman and would decide on who is invited to be members. Decisions would be taken by a majority, with each member state present getting one vote, but all would be subject to the chairman's approval.

"Each Member State shall serve a term of no more than three years from this Charter's entry into force, subject to renewal by the Chairman. The three-year membership term shall not apply to Member States that contribute more than U \$1,000,000,000 in cash funds to the Board of Peace within the first year of the Charter's entry into force," the draft says.

Critics are worried that Trump is trying to build an alternative, or rival, to the United Nations, which he has long criticized.

The board is described in the charter as "an international organization that seeks to promote stability, restore dependable and lawful governance, and secure enduring peace in areas affected or threatened by conflict." It would become official once three member states agree to the charter.

Trump has invited a number of world leaders, including Argentina's Javier Milei and Canada's Mark Carney, to be part of a Board of Peace for Gaza, which would be formed under the broader umbrella of his new Board of Peace.

That plan attracted swift criticism from Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu, who said the details hadn't been coordinated with his country.

Victor Davis Hanson reveals serious complications during cancer surgery, adds is 'recovering well'

QUOTE: In December, Hanson, 72, a famed author, scholar and conservative commentator, announced he would have a significant procedure after an alarmir biopsy. Former Secretary of State Condoleezza Rice shared an update about Hanson's recovery earlier this month, but Hanson's latest note offered additional insight into his surgery.

Hanson said that while his initial surgery went well, an “arterial bleed of unknown origins developed” while he was in the recovery room, which required an additional surgery. He considered himself “very lucky” that his medical team was able to locate the hemorrhaging and stop it.

He also expressed deep gratitude to both the team at Stanford Medicine and far wishing him a quick recovery.

"I want to thank all the wonderful people who have sent me wishes of rapid recovery and prayers in so many manifestations," Hanson said. "I cannot thank you enough given it gave me hope and encouragement these past two weeks as I read

and reread your notes, cards, and postings.

"I am recovering well from the lung cancer surgery, but now mostly dealing with after effects of the long time under anesthesia for the two procedures, blood loss, anemia, and some AFIB, which are all mostly manifested in fatigue and weakness. But I hope to rebuild and recover and return to work in time, especially given the frantic news cycle of the last month."

He added that lymph nodes and peripheral samples around the tumor proved negative for malignancy and a preoperative full-body scan "did not show metastasis." He plans to prepare for possible chemotherapy after further recovery to prevent a recurrence in the area.
